



- c. Scott Cook reported that Hallmark Youthcare experienced an increase in the overall rate of incidents during the first quarter of 2006 resulting in a rate which is comparable to the first three quarters of the previous year. Forty informal complaints were received and investigated. Twelve allegations of abuse were investigated, all of which were unfounded. Suicidal behavior was reported in 23 incidents, none of which led to physical harm. Four incidents of sexual acting out were handled administratively and with counseling.
- d. Chris Baham of National Counseling Group had nothing to report.

## II. State Updates

- a) Jim Bowser announced the Collette Ashiru has left the Office of Human Rights to take another position.
- b) Proposed revisions of the Human Rights Regulations are in the Governor's Office awaiting signature.
- c) New requirements will specify an LHRC quorum as no fewer than three members present, and require meetings at least twice a year. Training of LHRC members will be mandated, as well as a survey of members. Under FOIA, both draft and approved minutes of LHRC minutes must be posted on the DMHMRSAS website within 10 and three days respectively.
