C. Pleasant View Residential:

Residential facility for 4 individuals- 18 yr and above with mild to profound MR..

A Motion was made and passed to approve the affiliation request of Pleasant View Residential, with the provision that the exclusion policy be explained at the September 21, 2006, meeting. .

D. Family Maintenance Counseling:

Crisis intervention, intensive in home therapy 8-10 hours weekly for at-risk youth, 5-21 yrs. Systems theory used in treatment.

A Motion was made and passed to approve affiliation request of Family Maintenance.

E. Family Restoration

Serves youth at risk of removal from home. Provides in home counseling to stabilize situation in the home with child and family. Restraints only in emergencies. Crisis Wave techniques used.

A motion was made and passed to approve the affiliation request of

Family Restorations.
